MESSAGE FROM ARTISTIC DIRECTOR/ PIANIST KATHRYN SELBY, AM

Having lived most of my life within the beautiful and limitless boundaries of chamber music, it is a truly wonderful privilege to have access to, and be constantly exploring, original music from both beloved old masters and exciting new composers. Such is the case for my 19th Season in 2025.

As always, the programs reflect the stunning collaborative effort of all involved and showcase our deep love of melody, innovation and inspiration. We celebrate and honour the 150 years since Ravel's birth along with two Viennese masters in Tour 1, which is followed in May by the Australian premiere of a stunning work by the renowned Lera Auerbach with two favourite trios by Schumann and Smetana.

A gorgeous arrangement of Debussy's *Prélude à l'après-midi d'un faune* opens Tour 3 with Beethoven's *Ghost* and Shostakovich's powerful second trio. In September, we visit with the masters of song in Chopin and Schubert, with a tribute to Fanny and Felix Mendelssohn in a lovely work by Australian composer Anne Cawrse. And we close the season with luscious big piano quartets by Brahms, Fauré and Australian Matthew Hindson.

Not only do I have the honour of working once again with my old friends, violinists Natalie Chee, Daniel Dodds, Elizabeth Layton and Alexandra Osborne, and cellists Julian Smiles and Clancy Newman, but in 2025 I welcome for the first time to Selby & Friends the brilliant virtuoso violinist Kristian Winther and SSO Principal Cellist Catherine Hewgill. I'm delighted to once again welcome two accomplished young Australians to the Season currently studying in the US - the now 20-year-old cellist Benett Tsai who returns in July and young Sydney violist Isabella Bignasca in November.

These outstanding artists bring a wealth of experience, knowledge and charisma to the series, but alongside these important attributes are joy, generosity of spirit and a comradeship and willingness to share with their younger colleagues that is unparalleled.

This digital booklet shows a summary of the 2025 Concert Season with each of our five tours outlined on the pages ahead. It promises to be a very exciting season indeed of fabulous music, brilliant performers and new friends.

I warmly invite you to our 2025 Season and look forward to welcoming you with my friends.

What a delightful way to introduce the true song masters – Mendelssohn (both Fanny and Felix), Chopin and Schubert! Australian composer Anne Cawrse composed her lovely work as a special commission by the ABC and it reflects on the special relationship between the Mendelssohn siblings. Chopin's beautiful and only piano trio follows and it is no surprise that it envelops his uncanny ability to create repose, virtuosity and drama. Schubert's sizable final piano trio, composed shortly before his death, closes this stunning program encompassing the composers we adore for their genius with song. Allie Osborne returns for this program with Katie Hewgill, SSO Principal Cellist and an old friend who is warmly welcomed to S&F for the first time in 2025.

For this to occur, we must receive your subscription renewal by midnight on **2 December 2024**. For current subscribers renewing during the Early Bird promotion, this will guarantee your seat preference and seat allocation in our more intimate venues.

We **strongly** encourage patrons to use our <u>online ticket order link</u> and <u>Buy Tickets</u> through our website as this takes patrons to a choice of purchasing subscriptions or single tickets in the venue of their choice and provides an immediate receipt for your records.

We have now moved to online and door ticket sales only. For those patrons wishing to email or mail in their subscription/order form, please fully complete and follow the instructions on the <u>Ticket Order Form</u> and send it us either by <u>email</u> or by mail.

Please note some venues may have capacity restrictions. Seating allocation for renewing subscribers will therefore be processed and allocated in order of receipt, so please book early to avoid any disappointment.

Patrons purchasing as a group larger than two people will be able to sit together in reserved seating venues. Please ensure you provide details for those with whom you wish to be seated to avoid any errors in seating placement. Please refer to the <u>Venue Information</u> page for seating layout and updated policies for your venue.

Contactless Ticketing

2025 will see Selby & Friends continue with our contactless ticketing method in applicable venues.

We will not be issuing paper tickets for our 2025 Season. We strongly encourage all patrons to use our online ticketing portal through the Selby & Friends website for applicable venues. This is a secure portal, easy to understand and navigate, which allows patrons to use a credit card. Selby & Friends also provides the option of purchase via Direct Deposit or EFT for applicable venues.

Tickets for 2025: After purchasing through our online portal, patrons will receive a receipt directly from our Selby & Friends account via email. If you do not have access to email and prefer to mail your order form to our office, S&F will mail your ticket entry document to your supplied address.

Confirmation of purchase and supply of your E-Ticket, either by email or mail, with all relevant seating information, will be sent to purchasers from Selby & Friends in early 2025 when the Priority Seating Subscriber Renewal period ends. This E-Ticket will serve as your concert entry ticket.

As you enter the concert venue, you can either present it in virtual form on your mobile device or bring a hard copy you have printed at home. You will also need to bring a form of identification

(please see further information below). There will be no traditional paper tickets sent to you by mail.

If you purchase for friends, please supply their details at the time of purchase so we can keep our files up to date on their seating as well as yours. However, as the Primary Purchaser, only your name will be on the E-Ticket sent to you.

ID at point of entry: Patrons are requested to bring a form of identification to the concert along with the E-Ticket from Selby & Friends to show at the entrance to the concert should our staff request it.

If you have misplaced your entry email confirmation, please contact our office during office hours. Ticket exchanges for concerts in other venues will require a new entry pass to be sent to patrons by email before your scheduled concert.
